# **School of Music Doctoral Minors**

- 1. With the exception of the Opera Production minor, which may or may not be an Option A minor, depending on which courses are chosen, these minors are all Option A minors.
- 2. A doctoral minor in Music Education has not been included in the document since it is administered by the Department of Curriculum and Instruction in the School of Education, not in the School of Music. It is available to all of our doctoral music students. Contact the Music Education faculty for further information.
- 3. There are several areas of study in which we do not offer the DMA or the PhD (String Pedagogy, for example) or a Masters degree (Jazz Studies) that are available to our doctoral students as Internal Doctoral Minors.
- 4. For Minors in Music Performance areas, an audition may be required.

You will NOT be able to take Preliminary Exams until the Minor Form is completed and approved.
