TOEFL score

If you are a non-native speaker of English and <u>not</u> a citizen of Canada, the United Kingdom, or another country where English is the official language, please read the following statements:

- 1. I understand that I am required to submit a TOEFL score of 85 or higher no later than December 1 in order to be considered for admission to the School of Music.
- 2. I understand that the School of Music does <u>not</u> grant TOEFL waivers for U.S. degree holders, despite the Graduate School's offer to do so.
- 3. I understand that if my submitted score is below 92, I will be required to successfully complete at least one ESL course during my first semester at UW-Madison.

Financial statement

All international students, please read the following statements:

- 1. I understand that, if admitted, I will be required to show possession of sufficient funds to support 1 year of non-resident tuition and living expenses. The current amount is approx. USD 46,000.
- 2. If I receive TA funding from the School of Music, I understand that while a 50% Teaching Assistantship will cover the full amount, a 33.4% Teaching Assistantship will only cover approx. USD 42,000 of this amount. I will be responsible for showing the remainder (approx. USD 4,000) in order to complete my admission.
